Teenagers Talk to Teenagers About Values

On Wednesday between 1.30 - 2.15pm Kevin Lynch + Seadna Morey, two stars of the Clare Minor team who played in this years All-Ireland Final against Kilkenny, gave one of the best talks I've heard for a long time to the Confirmation Classes of Sixmilebridge and Kilmurry schools. These are the young people who will be leaving in different directions to secondary schools in 2011. For that the lads said "It's a stepping stone to whatever they want, facing new challenges, meeting new people from different areas."

They covered a number of key issues such as:

Success - Can't be achieved by taking shortcuts;

Preparation - is the key to success whether it is in academics, sport or in life.

Attitude - is one of the most important factors in our approach to life - a right attitude.

Commitment - when you commit to something stay with it.

Coping with Failure - the ability to pick oneself up when something goes wrong. Never give in to failure.

Peer Pressure - Learning to say NO - Having a sense of right and wrong.

The importance of God in One's life - going to Mass at weekends. Gathering with one's family is about asking God to be with you and help you and that too is important.

Confirmation - the Sacrament is about receiving Spirit and instilling us with Courage.
