

BACK TO SCHOOL

Schools - Primary, Secondary, Third Level open their doors these days and weeks to young people - to begin or further their education. All young people from our Parish Community have our best wishes.

Our two Primary Schools are central to our Community. Between them 670 young people - 530 in Sixmilebridge, 140 in Kilmurry will attend.

Schools are microcosm of Society - people with different ideas, ideals, ambitions, faiths. They have several functions. As well as providing the knowledge and basic skills such as reading, writing etc., they prepare children for their futures, as adults, parents and as leaders of the next generation. With the Parents Associations they organise talks on topics such as *Internet* Safety, Social Media, Bullying, Drugs etc. Both schools place a lot of emphasis on the value of exercise, creativity and on spiritual development. With the Parish and Parents they prepare children for the Sacrament of First Communion and Confirmation Both schools have Boards of Management whose members are expected to have a clear understanding of Catholic Education and a commitment to serve the ethos of the school. Ideally they will also have a commitment to the local community and help to foster the links between the school and the Community.

We are very aware it is an anxious time for parents, as children move through the different stages of schooling. It is especially daunting when their child goes to school for the first time, when they leave Primary to go to Secondary school and then move out to further education. All parents care for their children and the values that shape them. It is important that practical Christian values are fostered, above all in the home, in the wider Parish Community and of course in the School.

It is worth making the point that as they grow through the different stages of their young lives that Parents give them their space to develop their own sense of identity and independence and responsibility.

We pray for them all at our Masses this weekend and wish them well.
