A Sacred Time for Our Children

During this and the next two week-ends 140 children will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and First Holy Communion in our Parish. These are very special occasions for the children, their parents and other relatives, their teachers and the Parish Community. They are important socially but above all they have a deep spiritual and indeed sacred dimension. They are steps in their lives they will never forget. A lot of preparation has gone into preparing the children. During that preparation they get a wonderful experience of a Christian vision of life and its meaning. Our deepest hunger is spiritual. Our experience of goodness. beauty, and loving relationships at home, in school and in the community demonstrates the truth of Christ who cares so deeply for each one of us. It is vital that we adults nourish these values so that they grow up with a deep respect for truth, honesty, wisdom to know right from wrong and courage to be themselves under the guidance of those who care most for them.

Sacred Times and Sacred Places.

In spite of what some people might think there are still times and places sacred in life. Traditionally, in Ireland, one of these times was Sunday mornings and one of these places was the local Church. For many people they still are. In our community a big number of people gather with others from the community to thank God for the week, just gone, and to pray for oneself, one's family and special intentions. It is a special time to acknowledge there is a God and we need to give Him time.

It is important that other activities in sport or in business do not get in the way of people worshipping their God. We are all very aware that He gave us life and He gave us time. No one of us has any control over these. It is dangerous to over-test His Patience. There are 168 hours in the week. We should try to give this short time on Sunday morning to the community gathering to pray and to share.
