A Special Gathering

Thursday evening we gathered to celebrate two organisations - one 70 years old - the I.C.A. - the other - new The Mens Sheds first discussed in our Parish Pastoral Council in 2013. Both organisations represent cooperation, community, togetherness.

These concepts were vital in the end of the 19th Century in Ireland. They were responsible for giving hope and spirit to a down-trodden poverty stricken people.

When the I.C.A. was founded in Sixmilebridge/Kilmurry, Ireland was experiencing rationing as a result of World War 2. Emigration, poverty dominated but people had regained a certain pride, a sense of place and pride in that place. The G.A.A., Muinter na Tire and other

organisations had made huge contributions to this. As did the I.C.A. after it was founded in 1945.

Ireland has changed radically since then. The standard of living has improved considerably - first with Industrialisation, Free Education, and radically improved communications all in the 1960's. This took a major step forward between the mid 1990's and 2000's with the Celtic Tiger. But we became isolated

A sense of community was undermined and we have become all the poorer for it.

The Parish Council has consistently being involved in fostering community. The Mens Sheds sprung out of that. This was established as a friendly meeting place where men come together and undertake a variety of mutually agreed activities. It's a community based organisation.

The cup of tea, the chat, is vital to both the I.C.A. and Mens Sheds meeting. We celebrated both organisations on Thursday evening last. They and other local movements are as necessary in our times as in the 1940's

We congratulate them and wish them well.
