

## New Ballysheen Altar

The new altar was erected at a point in the graveyard which draws together the three phases of the development. The Old Church ruins surrounded by the original place of burial, the first extension developed some seventy years ago and finally the modern place of rest developed at the beginning of the 21st century.

Most of the stone for the altar was sourced locally.

The design on the front stone on the Altar is the Easter Message. As the sun rises in the distance Jesus rises to the new life of the First Easter to be shared with all humanity.

As we view the scene from inside the empty tomb, our attention is focused on the words of Jesus himself when He raised Lazarus to life "I am the resurrection and the Life"
