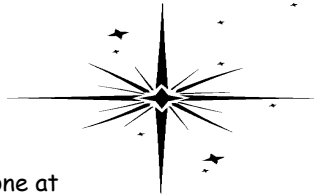

 of Heaven and Earth.**

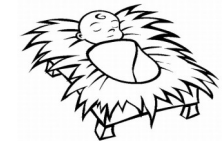
**For this, tonight, is the stable
