The Greatest Story Ever Told

That is the story we have recalled and re-enacted this past week. It was a true story and an extraordinary one. Jesus came to teach but more important to witness to values which would transform people's lives - individuals, families, institutions. They are very basic values but when applied make a huge difference - such as telling the truth, being there for others, especially for people experiencing hard times. I was hungry, homeless, in prison, sick, depressed, simply finding life difficult, and you cared and you helped. And these values were so important He was prepared to go through horrendous humiliation, denial, betrayal, physical and mental torture. And at times he was close to giving up - like in the garden when He asked His Father if it was possible that he would not have to go through all of this. But immediately He said 'Not my will but Thine be done.' The will of God. And He courageously stood to the very end against the powers that be, religious and secular because he not only taught values, He witnessed to them and Christianity became a great movement. Up to the early 1960's Believing and Belonging were the same thing for us in Ireland. Our faith was nourished in a deep inheritance. Not so now but there was never a greater need for Christian values. To rediscover the vital importance of religion and God in our lives we have to first discover our souls, and to realize what a Celtic Tiger life-style has done to us. An important step would be to reflect on the Greatest Story Ever Told in the context of our own lives.

The Spiritual Awakening our world badly needs will come when it is rooted in Christ. To pray, to gather with the rest of the community is a way of nourishing this.
