Respecting Nature

Now and again here in our Parish Community we remind
 ourselves that the Celtic year revolved around four great
 feasts:

1st February, with the start of tilling, the birth of lambs,
the return of fishermen to the sea and varied efforts to
 foretell the weather for the coming Summer.

1st May, when cattle returned to the grass.

1st August, the celebration of the first fruits of the
 harvest.

1st November, the feast of the disappearing Sun and the
 other world.

These great feasts were integrated into the lives of Irish
 Christians. They were part of life and living. In spite of
 the efforts of a clerical Church to purge many of these
 traditional practices the people clung to their traditional
 ritual celebrations which probably dated back more than
 two thousand years.

We have tried to revisit many of these through our area
 gatherings, through our efforts to connect faith and cul-
 ture, to respect Nature and to be aware of the hand of
 God in life here and hereafter.

A few years ago when fishermen were drowned in
January off the South East Coast of Ireland we reminded
 ourselves that people who lived life according to Celtic
 traditions would never go to sea in January, never before
 the 1st February.

We are saddened again this January to hear that the lives
 of fishermen have been taken this time off the South
 West Coast.

We pray for those who have lost their lives. We pray for
 their loved ones. And we pray that we will never take
 nature for granted, but that we will always respect it.
