## The Ups and Downs of Life

There is a saying -

The Lord walks straight in crooked lines.

In life there are the losses and the findings. In our Parish in the past week we had Baptisms, Wedding, Funerals, Mass
on a farm, Mass in a house - where neighbours and fami-
lies gathered - all these happenings part of all the other, not
so public, visits, stories of the ups and downs of life. We
had prayer - public and private - which included our Daily
Masses, our Guided Meditation which suggested - Forgive
and experience the peace and freedom Forgiveness
brings. We had our Eucharistic Adoration - In His Agony in
the Garden when He experienced such awful mental tor-
ture and about to face terrible physical pain He asked 'Can
you not watch even one hour with me' We had our Bene-
diction, Rosary and people prayed at home, in private and
as family.

All of this and more took place in parallel with the daily living, working, playing. We are in different situations - some of us are very busy at work, others of us have no work, some are comfortable, others struggle, some in good relationships, others lonely and alone etc.

This weekend we gather to hear what the Lord has to say to us and to thank Him for what He means to us. We have the story of the sisters, Martha and Mary - Martha the busy one, Mary sits and listens to Jesus. The message is obvious - we need to be 'doing' but we need to take time out, to pause in the Presence of a higher power.

When we are so bogged down in the craziness around us, in the challenges of life Jesus is clear about the way forward. First, sit and listen to Him. This is good advice. Then we might be better prepared to cope with life and its challenges.

Keeping the balance is important - *Work, Pray, Play.* Keep in mind too - the Global, the National happenings are one thing - the daily living, coping, caring in our homes, our local community is another.

Our circle of influence is local-it is there we are influenced and can influence.
