Eucharistic Adoration

Between 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. every Friday afternoon a number of people spend some quiet time, in the Baptismal area of the Church, before the Blessed Sacrament. For the most part this takes the form of spending 1 hour - 3-4, 4-5, 5-6, 6-7, just being, resting the mind, calming down, finding peace. They do this in the **Presence of Jesus.**

Be still and know that I am God.

At a time when people are turning to programmes such a yoga, mindfulness etc., in their search for Peace of Mind those of us who spend an hour once a week in His Presence have found that we can find it brings that 'Quietening Down' 'Calming' to us. Because of holidays the people involved have suggested that for the months of July and August the hours will be reduced to 2 hour sessions:

5 - 6 p.m. + 6 - 7 p.m.

We appreciate that some people may find a full hour difficult, that we can get very distracted, that it is not easy to commit to a particular hour every Friday. Because of that we will give some time thinking through how we can get around these difficulties, and in that way encourage more people to get involved. Can I remind you again the time we give to this can be very rewarding and indeed very special.

Eircode is the new postcode system for Ireland. During July a letter will be sent to all addresses in Co. Clare, notifying them of the Eircode for that address. Your address does not change, you simply include the Eircode at the bottom of your address. There are many benefits to using Eircode, including making it guicker and easier for medical emergency services and others to locate addresses. It is safe to give an Eircode to anyone you would normally give your address to.

The Eircode Community Outreach Programme involves local organisations and volunteers in Co. Clare. in helping reach out to people who may need further information on Eircode. The programme is particularly interested in ensuring that people reach out to people they know, friends, family and neighbours, who they feel might get left behind, particularly older people living alone. The Outreach person for Co. Clare, Madeline McAleer, is leading efforts across the county and would be delighted to talk to local organisations about Eircode. Madeline is particularly interested in hearing from people who might want to hear more themselves, or who might help to identify people in their area who might need assistance.
