During the next week each day, we here in the Parish will journey with the Events and themes of the Eucharistic Congress. The overall theme of the Congress is 'Communion with Christ and One Another'. The Eucharist connects Catholics all over the world, at local level, Nationally and Internationally. International Eucharistic Congress usually takes place every four years. The last two were in Quebec City, Canada in 2008 and Mexico in 2004. The last one in Ireland was 1932. The Congress has been described as a Spiritual Olympics, a kind of Spring Show or a World Youth Day for Adults.

We celebrate the Eucharist almost every day here in the parish. We are a Eucharistic Community. During the coming week we will connect with this extraordinary and exciting events of the week.
