## CHURCH BUILDING

Our two Churches are at the heart of our community. They are sacred places. When I celebrated my Mother's funeral Mass I realised this was in the same Church where she had participated in Sunday Mass throughout her life, where she had received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and Marriage as well. My Father who came from another Parish died suddenly in that Church, at 11 o'clock Mass on Easter Sunday morning, as the priest was preaching on the Resurrection. That Church has always had a special place in my heart.

For many people, especially in rural Ireland, the entire circle of life is celebrated in one Sacred place. For other people the location of these special moments are shared between Churches, but are still sacred and celebrated. Our Church is a place of memories and living where people gather to pray, to remember, to celebrate, to mourn, to look for guidance, help and consolation. People come to Church for the ordinary and extraordinary. We attend Mass at weekends, we pray with the rest of the community for ourselves and for others. We have the social experiences - *the chat after Mass, the newsletter, the local news, the visitors now and again.*

We gather for the special times - **Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Feast Days.** There is the comforting familiarity of where people sit, the statues, Baptismal area, candles, sanctuary lamp, the choir, the prayer and the building itself.

It's a special place - our local Church. It is full of memories, routine and celebration all combining to connect us to one another and to our God. It is the home of the soul.

Right now our souls need nourishment. We need inner strength, peace of mind, and we need to nourish community.

It is one thing to brighten the walls and the floors. Maybe it's a time renew our faith in the **Real Presence of Jesus** in this Sacred place and in our lives.
