50th International Eucharistic Congress 10th - 17th June, 2010 in Dublin

The 50th International Eucharistic Congress is a week long programme of events, linking faith and culture, with a particular focus on the gathering of people of every nation, language and way of life around the table of the Lord.

The theme for the Congress is

"The Eucharist: Communion with Christ and with one another."

The **Congress Bell** has been fitted into a carrying frame in which it will be brought on foot from place to place around Ireland by teams of volunteers. It will be a focal point for gathering and for prayer, in cathedrals, parish churches and places of pilgrimage. This will be in our Diocese for 10 days in October.

One of the key moments in the pastoral preparation for the 50th International Eucharistic Congress is the celebration of a short National Eucharistic Congress on June 25th and 26th of this year. People from every diocese will gather together in **Knock** on June 25th and there will be a liturgical celebration in each diocese the following day, June 26th, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi.

We will officially launch this in our Parish at the 11.00 a.m. Mass on Sun. 26th with the lighting and blessing of our Parish Candle. We will also hear the new **Eucharistic Congress Hymn on that day.**
