Reopening of our Churches

On Tuesday June 30th we will reopen our Churches for the celebration of Mass and Sacraments with the People of God present. For the foreseeable future, the Sunday obligation will remain suspended. If you wish you may attend Mass on any day, but also know you are not under any obligation to attend until you feel it safe to do so. There are many options of hearing Mass in our own homes.

For those who wish to attend please note there will be many changes with regard to ongoing health and safety measures. We expect to begin in a cautious way at first, and there will be a need for patience and careful monitoring of the situation.

Social distancing will be an ongoing requirement with approximately 2 metres separation between persons. This does not apply to family members from the same household.

At a recent meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council the following was agreed....

Numbers attending will need to be monitored to meet the required distancing guidelines.

Please use hand sanitizers which are available at Church entrances.

People are asked to wear face masks to Church and only remove them to receive Holy Communion.

Stewards will meet people on entry and show them into their seats.

Eucharistic Ministers will wear visors as they distribute Holy Communion.

Baskets for Church Offerings will be left at the entrance to the Churches.

Holy Communion will be distributed at the very end of Mass. Altar Servers will be introduced at a later stage.

Once you are seated we would ask that you remain in your seat until Mass is over.

The toilet will not be open.

These arrangements will take some time to get used to and so we ask that you pay attention to the stewards or others who may be directing. We are all responsible for our own safety.

The main purpose of all this is that we all remain safe and well.

Trust - Our lives are lightened by people we can trust. We need to trust so much in life. We know the great pain when our trust is shaken by people we thought we could trust. In the Gospel today Jesus addresses that need and grace in our lives. He encourages us to place our trust in those who care for us, and to trust in God who does not want destruction, but development, who wants peace among people in all sorts of ways.

Where there is Love there is God.
