Ordinary People - You and Me - Are the Future

Peter and Paul - two unlikely characters to get Christianity off the ground. Peter a hot headed Fisherman and Paul who went house persecuting the followers of this dangerous cult of Jesus - the young revolutionary. They answered, the call because they came to believe 'this is right' - this message makes sense; its practical; its about believing in a God who in turn, is about justice and friar play, about peace of mind, at home, in relationships, about mystery, and about a community of people within which they respect one another, all there for one another, when some are sick, or in trouble, not in a hurry to stand in judgement and do their best to forgive. All these things and more.

It was very ordinary people led that movement, and its the same now. Ordinary people are called on now and again to show the way in leading the Christian come back, in living the values and many are doing that in the way they live their lives.

This is a time to have courage. When Jesus said to Peter - Follow Me - He was leaving him in no doubt living and witnessing to Christ and Christianity will not be a bed of roses. He will not be able to walk where he likes' and do his own thing. Following Jesus is going to take him to places he would rather not go.

It's a reality for us now too. A man of the world told me during the week - he said to a few people - "I can't go somewhere, I'm going to Mass." They were amazed. That took courage. He was prepared to do what he believed in. We could give a lot of examples of the importance of having courage and never to deny who we are and what we stand for as Christians.

We never know what is around the corner and what we might have to deal with - whether illness, accident, loss, letting go of someone we love.

Our Novena over the last nine days here touched in a very special way into the power of Prayer and putting our trust in Jesus. When we act out of our Christian values we get a deep sense of being tuned to ourselves. Think of the people you really admire - are they not the people who have the courage to live by their principles and values.
