 Marian, Una, Dympna, his in-laws, and many friends were stunned. A  
 genuine sense of grief gripped people across the county. It was ironic that  
 a car was responsible for his death. From an early age he loved them. He  
 was described as "a genius with cars" and so he was, but not only that he  
 never let anyone down who had a problem with them. He was a kind man,  
 who treated everyone the same. He was a man with a great soul who  
 touched a lot of souls. Deeply spiritual. A man of honour. He will be sadly  
 missed by a lot of people but by none more than his loving wife, daughters,  
 mother, brothers, sisters. Our hearts go out them. We will keep them in
