 different centres around the West of Ireland. These are inter-
 generational Programmes i.e. Connecting the generations. She
 is a wonderful speaker, practical and has a lot to offer parents,
 teachers and indeed the wider community.

Aware Together - Grow Together

As members of the Sixmilebridge/Kilmurry Community it is im-
 portant that we are aware of the risks to our Community, and in
 particular those posed to our youth. An estimate puts the num-
 ber of children in our Community at 1,400 children; 300Pre-

 positive and supportive environment for our young people to
