 abuse before it can begin. The Diocese has introduced prevention
 standards which empower concerned people to spot problems, recog-
 nize unsafe practice, and take action to prevent abuse happening.

REFLECTION

(from a letter written to the Institutional Church
 by Carlo Caretto in 1984.)

*"How much I must criticise you, my Church
 and yet how much I love you!
 You have made me suffer more than anyone
 and yet I owe you more than I owe anyone.
 I should like to see you destroyed and yet I need your presence.
 You have given me much scandal
 and yet you alone have made me understand holiness.
 Never in the world have I seen anything more compromised, more
 false, yet never have I touched anything more pure,
 more generous or more beautiful.
 Countless times I have felt like slamming the door of my soul in your
 face – and yet,
 every night, I have prayed that I might die in your sure arms!
 No, I cannot be free of you, for I am one with you,
 even if not completely you.
 Then too – where should I go? To build another Church?
 But I cannot build another Church without the same defects,
 for they are my own defects.
 And again, if I were to build another Church, it would be my Church,
 not Christ's Church. No... I am old enough.... I know better!"*
