The New Roman Missal

The words we say and hear at Mass will soon be changing. There are not many changes to the People's Prayers. However, some said by the Priest will see significant changes.

In 2002, a new edition of the Missal in Latin was approved by the late Pope John Paul II. Last year 2010, a new English translation of the Latin Edition was completed and approved by Pope Benedict for use in English speaking Countries. The changes are the result of that new translation.

Over the coming months, we will be preparing to use the new translation. This weekend, an explanatory leaflet is available for you to read giving you a brief explanation of the changes and a little bit of history to set it in context.

From September next, our Sunday Missalettes will begin on a phased basis to introduce us to the changes. The new Missal will come into use in Ireland on the first Sunday of Advent 27th November.
