MISSION ALIVE

October is called Mission month: We are asked to think about what it means. For generations it meant priests and nuns going to foreign places to bring the message of Christ to peoples who never heard of it. That meant preaching or teaching the Word of God, but it also meant bringing Education (Schools), Health and Medical Services (Hospitals), and many services to the poorest of the poor. It was Christianity in practise and many of the people who left home and homeland were real heroes and heroines some of whom gave their life.

In our time there are many young men and women going to work amongst the poorest of the poor. We want to remember them today. We want to thank God for their generosity. Many of them are from among ourselves. They not only work directly with poverty-stricken people but some tackle unjust regimes which deprive people of the basic necessities of life. In a special way we think of all the Irish men and women who, give their time and talents through organisations, such as Trócaire, to bring some dignity to the lives of people who never had it. And, of course, we are very aware now that Mission has to be very much part of our Christian approach to life at home. The Christian Way is very much about Community.

Parish Communities do not just happen. Community needs to be creatively built, fostered and nourished. We try to build this concept of Christian Community - in word and through practical initiatives.

This October we pledge to continue our Mission to build community - at home and abroad.
