#### Parents –First Comm - Conf. Children

There was a big turnout of parents on Thursday night for Mass and talk in preparation for First Communion and Confirmation. The talk was given by Gareth Heagney, Principal Sixmilebridge N.S. In his talk he outlined ....

- An overview of preparation in schools for the sacraments with reference to Alive O Programme and Do this In Memory of Me.
- 2. The role of schools, parish and especially parents in that regard.
- The special importance of community life not only in the lead up to the Sacraments but in the life of the children as a whole.
- The special connection between the Christian Values they are encountering in programmes with general spirituality and morality.

He stressed that First Communion and Confirmation were monumental occasions for children, their families, the schools. the Parish. They are a major step in the overall development of a child. They are occasions which need to be taken very seriously and indeed are taken seriously in that the three big institutions within a parish, namely, family, school, parish community are all involved in preparing the children for these. At school, through the programmes, they learn what the Christian message is all about but he stressed that this makes sense only when it connects to the child's life in the home and in the community. He also stressed the importance of weekly Mass, Prayer, Daily Living and in general the role of a Catholic School in all of this. Finally, he said, at the end of the day all of this is by way of helping the child to grow into human values such as awareness of right and wrong, the wisdom to be able to distinguish between these, goodness, truth, sense of connecting to others, to forgive and to be forgiven.

We want to thank Gareth in a very special way for his excellent input and for sharing his own deep faith with us all.
