Swimming Upstream

Finding Positives in a Negative Ireland

This book had been in the writing for over two years. Most of it was written either in a hospital ward or in recovery at home. It analyses the major changes which took place in Irish society and in the Church from the 1960's to the present time. It outlines the range of practical initiatives Harry has been involved in. The title of the book "Swimming Upstream" reflects something of his struggle with the kind of Church we have become and with the centralization of power in big government, big banks, big corporations and away from the local families and communities.

In the foreword Bishop Willie Walsh says: "Harry was never content to go with the flow but always prepared to explore different directions and possibilities that were against the current of popular or accepted norms."

Everything he undertook was based on values of truth, justice, self-reliance, family, community. He believes deeply in developments which are people centred and in a Church that must go to the people and not expect the people to come to it. There is an urgent need for a change in direction in the Church and Country. The people must be given responsibility.

The range of initiatives are wide ranging – a number within the Parish of Sixmilebridge/Kilmurry but also Rural Housing, Rural Resource Developments, Urban Developments, establishment of a Community Hospital, re-opening of a Mart, G.A.A. writings, broadcasts, lecture giving, spirituality lectures and coping with serious illness. These are all touched on in this book. Overall he is saying that the big challenge for our future is to develop the local with the emphasis on family and community as a balance to the Global. Becoming more self-reliant, more involved, better neighbours, identifying our own resources and developing them are crucial to our future.

The book will soon be in the shops from Monday on and will be launched by Davy Fitzgerald on Nov. 22 in the G.A.A. Hall in Sixmilebridge. The proceeds from this book are going to Cahercalla Hospice, Ennis and could be an ideal present for Christmas.
