## Reflection - The Feet of the Sun

"When we look at the sun in the evening, we often see the rays of light hitting the Earth. In Irish they are called *'cosa na gréinne - the feet of the sun'* We can think of them as God's feet walking along our scorched and wounded earth: through the poverty and the illness of His world, through fields full of landmines and unexploded bombs, the rays of light take their pilgrimage from heaven through our world, which needs the light of God so badly. Even in persecution the Presence of God is near.

**Parents and Parenting** Over the last few years we have spent a considerable amount of time on Parents and Parenting. We all agree that there is no group of people in our society more important than parents. It is a very old saying *"the hand that rocks the cradle rules the world"* Certainly the hands that rock the cradle shapes the future of a child and young people. It used to be said too *"it takes a community, a village to raise a child"*.

In our time we have experienced enormous change in both family and community. Our Parenting Programmes have indicated that Parents are now experiencing enormous pressure.

They have indicated in our recent survey that there are five issues which seriously concern them:

Social Media, Bullying, Peer Pressure, Abuse of Drugs and what parents describe as Busyness.

In one of the Programmes we asked the young people what they want most at home. The answer they gave was time - with Mammy and Daddy - not things. When the Parents were presented with this, they agreed that they are too busy. There is nothing more important than the time they give to their children. We no longer need to stress the need for practical programmes for parents to support and help them to cope with the challenges they are faced with. We are now facilitating parents to engage in small groups in each others homes to address the issues they themselves have identified. They have already agreed on the practical steps to be taken and the outcome which will lead to parents supporting one another facilitated by and supported by both schools and parish. This is an exciting venture for us all.

**N.B.** In view of the exposure to modern technology devices adults and especially parents are warned 'We are now sleep walking into a new world while our children are already out in it.'. It is time to wake up to the call to take not of the warning.
