This weekend we are gathering in appreciation in what we have. This may not be an easy thing for a lot of people because their focus is mainly on what they haven't. They are going through difficult times for one reason or another. In our efforts to identify what we have to be thankful for we'll pray for those of us who might find this impossible.

This weekend we might make a special effort to step back from some of the bad news including whatever is troubling ourselves. Instead we might try to identify a few things we take for granted. They might be very simple and straight forward. I was reading Jim Styne's book during the week. As you know Jim was a great footballer. Got cancer. Had a wife and two children. Unfortunately he got the worse form of cancer – 23 tumours in all – and died. He said at one stage when you're sick all you want is to get your health back. We take it for granted. So obviously this weekend we could include the obvious things such as the roof over our heads, the food on the table, family, friends.

Over the last few weeks we have gathered with young people and parents preparing for First Communion and Confirmation. Parents promised to prepare them in the home. There can be no better way to do that than to help them grow up thanking God and people for what they have. In helping children to be grateful we are helping a generation to grow up with a positive attitude to life and helping ourselves to develop that same positive attitude in ourselves.
