Today's Gospel is a wake-up call. It tells us what Jesus expects of us. We must be humble and genuine, thinking of others rather than worrying about what people will think of us.

OUR DIOCESE

The Diocese of Killaloe, like every other Irish Diocese, is experiencing significant changes - fewer and fewer priests, more and more aging priests, decline in Mass attendance etc., Above all, our Society is changing fast and we wonder where our values are coming from and where do we get direction from ?

Could we ask you to pray that these few days and the issues we will be addressing will take place in a spirit of Christ-like humility and genuine openness in the direction God is calling us at this time.

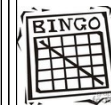

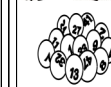
