The background to the sails is a sun which refers also to the Eucharist.

## The Scourge of Jealousy

When a person is recovering from surgery, even a few rounds of it and have time in your hands you begin to think a bit about the deeper things of life. That includes one's own life, life as reflected every day in the media, some of the awful happenings, life for people who struggle - with poor health, great losses, money problems, relationships and so on. Where or from whom do we get the inspiration to cope and even to look at life in a more positive way? Most of us are so pre-occupied with the bits and pieces of life and living we don't have time to pause and think. Even if wise words are spoken they don't sink.

One of the readings at Mass theses week ends is from St. James Last Sunday's Reading opened - wherever you find jealousy and ambition, you find disharmony. There is nothing wrong with a certain amount of ambition but jealousy can do serious damage and lead to anything. James mentions wicked things can be done as a result.

I paused on this thing of jealousy - the damage it is doing. It means, for a start, if I'm jealous I'm not secure in myself. It means too I'm not at peace with myself. James says: Where do these wars and battles between yourselves first start? Isn't it precisely in the desires fighting inside your own selves? You want something and you haven't got it; So you are prepared to kill. You have an ambition that you cannot satisfy; so you fight to get your way by force!!

Where then do we find Peace of Mind, the strength to cope and to be positive about life? I suppose we find it in different places and people. As we make our journey the support of fellow travellers can offer much courage and help as we set out to walk again into the light. Compassion is a great gift when we find it in others and I we can develop it in ourselves. To show compassion means leaving jealousy and other hang-ups we might have, outside. It means thinking of others and reaching out to them.

The most compassionate person ever to have walked this earth was Jesus. Spending a little time in His Presence can make a big difference. Jealousy brought about His death. It can do awful damage.

Let it go, if there is some of it in you.
