We, in our time, are experiencing extraordinary change. It's in the world of technology - especially communications technology. We are trying to work our way through a deadly global pandemic. Its climate change and we had an experience of that in the past week.

These massive changes effect us all and there are the people wo have to manage them. Parents have to manage the Internet for their children. Medical people and Government have to manage a changing virus situation - the weather experts warned us about the storm, how and when to cope.

And we are trying to cope with institutional change - in society and Church. In these aspects of change it is worth remembering - institutions can do harm or good. What they do depends on one thing: the people. Big or small they are made up of people.

People have values and these values shape what they do. There is an old saying, worth thinking about at a time of rapid change: "Its the few who make things happen, the many who watch things happening and the majority who don't know what's happening".

And there are very many who say a lot - self- styled experts and yet they manage so little. It's a time for **humility**, being able to say about many things, when asked for your opinion: "I don't know". Sometimes when approached with an idea to say 'will it do any good?'

Its easy to talk about what is wrong in the Church or Government, say, but not so easy to come up with concrete, realistic solutions. This is a time to realise there are no easy solutions but it is a time for wisdom, for constructive ideas, for patience, for courage.

This is why in trying to bring about major change in our Church we can recognise all of this in Pope Francis. And he is paying a price for it from within the Church. These are not easy times, at any level of Church, but it is important to realise the importance of going back to the Sacred - Christ - for inspiration and courage. He had to suffer rejection, insults, torture and a horrible death. There were very few on the Hill of Calvary when he was dying - His mother and a few others. Even his closest friends denied Him and walked away. Contrast that with populist politics now.


Yet Christianity was born and spread across the world because the values were right.
