Brendan O'Regan Biography Project

A new website dedicated to promoting awareness of one of Clare's outstanding innovators, Sixmilebridge native Brendan O'Regan has been officially launched. The website has been developed by the Brendan O'Regan Biography Project team and is sponsored by Clare County Council and IDA Ireland.

The purpose of the new website is to provide, in digital format, comprehensive information regarding the life and ideas of Brendan O'Regan, the man responsible for establishing the world's first duty free shop at Shannon Airport and Ireland's first tax-free Industrial Estate in the Shannon Free Zone.

Born in Sixmilebridge in 1917, Brendan was greatly influenced by his father James O'Regan who was a local hotelier and Chairman of Clare County Council. The family owned Regan's Pub in the village which later became **The Olde House**.

His father encouraged Brendan to take a leadership role in public life and provided him with an understanding of the importance of business enterprise in improving social conditions while creating financial wealth.

Brendan O'Regan initiated Ireland's first programme of foreign direct investment in manufacturing, based on a favourable enterprise climate. Internationally, hie is acknowledged as the father of the €70 billion a year airport Duty-Free business.

Out of concern for world poverty, he worked closely with bodies such as the United Nation, the World Bank and Irish charity, Trócaire, in their efforts to establish export processing zones, modelled on the Shannon experience, in developing countries.

He also set up Ireland's first hotel management school, Shannon College of Hotel Management, now part of NUI Galway, the first new town in Ireland since the medieval era, Shannon. He was also key in having Bunratty Castle resorted for tourism promotion.

Many of his activities took place in the 60-year period between 1938 and 1998, a time of change and improvement in Ireland. His contributions to economic, social and cultural development would help to shape modern Ireland.

The official launch of the new website was hosted by Clare County Council and IDA Ireland in collaboration with Brendan O'Regan Biography Project Team.
