Last Thursday Fr. Harry was the recipient of a National Award in the R.D.S. Dublin for his outstanding contribution to rural and community development across Ireland.

He as been to the forefront of the revitalisation of a number of rural communities. He's responsible for encouraging communities across Ireland to participate in and determine their own future through a range of practical initiatives.

His work has let to the rolling out of a major rural development programme in Europe in 1991.

In 1998 he founded Céifin - purpose of which is to reflect, the base and direct values led change. His grasp of National and European policy is matched by his capacitate to understand what is needed on the ground for ordinary people trying to improve the lives of their families and communities.

His vision, dynamism and his tireless commitment to building a viable future has contributed significantly to the development of this country and beyond.

He has published many books and also broadcast widely on radio and television.

Fr. Harry's Response ... " I followed my Dream"

From a very young age I felt the pain of forced emigration when I witnessed broken hearted mothers and fathers cling to their son or daughter as they were having to let go - sometimes for ever. Experiencing that from within a small rural community. like Feakle. sparked something in me to commit myself to do something about it. It is why I brought a passion and commitment to the systems of family in communities at local level at the heart of my life's work. They represented deep connections for me - with my own inner self, others, creation, creator. And in a sense the call to be a priest afforded me the opportunity to follow my instincts.

In any walk of life there are no substitutes for passion and enthusiasm. I think I had them in spades for what I went on to do.

All the academic stuff, colleges and university only helped me focus on this work.

My practical experiences with families in soul-less urban housing estates and high rise flats convinced me that economics - a narrow form of it - can never measure the health of a society or the health of a family or community.

We all know a house is a basic necessity of life, but a home is a more important concept.

Brendan O'Regan (1917-2008) an innovator, entrepreneur and ultimately, one of the Great Men of 20th Century Ireland.
