The Most Holy Trinity One God in Three Persons

Father Revealing himself as our heavenly Father, god proved that He is not a distant, fickle, or vindictive God. He is a God for whom family is everything. Like a father, He wants to be close to us. He promises to care for us and look after us. He wants nothing but good for us.
